

CAMP MISHEWAH SEASONAL BOATING POLICY & AGREEMENT

If you have a motorboat or jet-ski that you are bringing to camp with you, we have a boating policy in place for you to be aware of and we require you to agree to the following:

- I agree to notify the Camp Office upon arrival that I have brought a motorized watercraft with me.
- I agree to placing a docking/anchoring tag on my watercraft for the duration of the time it is at camp. Docking/anchoring fees will apply.
- I agree to local "Lake Etiquette" requiring that no one performs high speed passes by the camp or our neighbour's properties.
- I will reduce my speed to 10 KM when leaving or returning to the shore and will not create a wake within 30 metres of the shore.
- I agree to not drive my jet-ski onto or near the shore. I will cut my motor and dismount in shallow water.
- I agree to wash my watercraft before I launch it in order to stop the spread of zebra mussels into Round Lake.
- I agree to have a spotter in place if I pull skiers or tubes.
- A docking fee is being implemented this summer for seasonal docking. You need to register and pay for your boat to be docked for the season when you renew your site.
- Please practice good docking etiquette. Other people's boats should never be touched or moved. You will be assigned a docking spot for the summer.

The OPP patrol the lake. Be sure you have your license and all paperwork and required safety equipment. Also, our neighbours will appreciate it if you do not enter what is considered their private space along the shore.

This is a reminder from the [Round Lake Property Owners Association](#):

*A friendly reminder to those boating on the Bonnechere River section from the south end of the lake to the dam. There is a **10kph** speed limit on the river. Not only is this the law, but it also cuts down on the destructive wake that speeding crafts produce and thus protects shoreline habitat of nesting loons this time of year. It also prevents shoreline erosion which is a problem on this section of river and maintains safety for other boaters, swimmers, and non-motorized watercraft. Thank you in advance for your consideration and compliance.*
